
#### THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT

We continue to shelter the guests in our program previous to the shelter in place order to limit exposure to contagion. With our guests staying the the day center we had a need for more fridge space. Within a few days of making the need known, a donor aided us in obtaining a standard size refrigerator. We are not able to accept new guests during the pandemic. However, we have helped multiple families with groceries and supplies while they struggle to navigate their new circumstances and altered budgets. All groceries and supplies were donated by generous supporter of FPRC. In addition, our host and support congregations continue to support and

supply meals, supplies, and limited fellowship to keep our guests' morale up.
