WHAT A SUCCESS!

Wow! We had a fantastic month. Since the beginning of August Family Promise of Roane County served 14 families. These families were provided a variety of services including rent or utility assistance, food provisions, diapers, wipes, and bags full of hygiene products. Every time a new family came in for help they had the look of despair on their face. I (director) often heard "I hate to ask for help." As they walked out the door with their hands full they had smiles on their faces. I just jump for joy when I see the families faces brighten.

Since June we have provided services to 68 individuals. Eighty three percent of the individuals were children. All those who applied for assistance were given aide. We happily, provided \$ 3,835 worth of rent and utility help to ensure families were able to maintain stable housing.

Eviction Crisis

Without new relief measures to help more struggling families afford rent and avoid eviction, millions of households could face housing instability, homelessness, and greater overall hardship in the coming months.

Data shows the COVID-19 crisis impacts low-income households. Job losses have been heavily concentrated in industries that pay low average wages, and households with high housing costs and low incomes often have little financial cushion. Recent Census data show 1 in 5 renters report being behind on rent, with households of color reporting far higher rates of missed payments compared to the national average.

Congress included a limited ban on evictions in the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of March, but this moratorium expired on July 24. This Act helped households avoid eviction but, did prevent families from accruing debt. People still owe rent payments even when they cannot be evicted for non-payment, so they are still at risk of eviction when any federal, state, or local moratoriums end if they are unable to pay their current rent or make up the past-due amounts.
